Abstract: **Aubrey Dean Eversole**

In this interview Aubrey tells of his unique relationship with Mr. Joe Clyde Wessendorff. He describes Mr. Wessendorff's personality, his Lucchese boots, his hunting escapades and a rare act of generosity.

Mr. Eversole was born in February, 1940 in Damon, Texas and has worked at the Richmond Barbershop since the 1960's. Initially, the shop was called McFarlane but later changed to Richmond while always maintaining its original location on Morton Street in downtown Richmond. The Richmond Barbershop's history goes back to the 1800s.
