Shantha was born in Iran in 1951 and lived there until age 12 when a revolution forced her family to relocate to India and Brunei. She earned a Bachelor degree in Education.

Raghu was born in 1944 in India where both families knew each other. This led to an arranged marriage that has lasted over 40 years.

After medical school in India and England, Raghu and Shantha moved to Ohio for 2 years before relocating to the warmer climate in Houston, Texas.

It was a difficult transition learning a new culture and food but they both enjoyed meeting people. They looked up Indian names in the phone book and called to meet a new friends.

While Raghu concentrated on his medical practice, Shantha worked until her children were born. Then she volunteered at their schools and got involved in their activities.

Later Shantha volunteered for various non-profit service organizations and started the Asians Against Domestic Abuse (AADA). She was instrumental in helping various organizations understand the needs of Asian immigrants.

They love living in Sugar Creek and enjoy the diverse culture of Sugar Land.
