# Abstract: Clyde Thomas (C. T.) Renfrow

C. T.'s family were entrepreneurs who owned most of the businesses in Fresno and his mother was the postmistress for 35 years. They owned a grocery store and meat market, the local service station, as well as a dairy and beef cattle ranch and raised hay. Along with his brothers and sisters, they were kept busy helping at the various businesses and eventually taking over some of them.

C. T. graduated in the early 1960s with the first senior class at Dulles High School with 88 in his class. He eventually was a successful distributor for the *Houston Chronicle* for 45 years with over 4,000 customers. In his spare time, he and his father-in-law built houses in Sugar Land, Austin and Galveston. He and his first wife were also direct distributors for Amway products.

He and his second wife, Kathy, joined their family of 5 together and now have 12 grandchildren. He is a great story teller and shares many interesting tales of life in Fresno, Texas.
