Abstract: Constance Ann Harris Seger

In this charming interview Constance Ann Harris Seger recalls childhood visits to Fulsher, Texas to be with her grandparents, Hunter Pinckney Harris and Amilee McKithan Harris on their farm. But the interview goes much further than that, relaying her family's long, long history in Texas.

Constance was born on June 25, 1943, in Paris, Texas. She and her siblings considered it a "great treat" to be in the country visiting her grandparents where there was always good food and plenty of room to play in the barn or the very large pasture chasing sheep. They used to catch horny toads on the prairie on the edge of Fulshear and take them back to the metropolis of New Orleans where their friends were horrified.

Many of her ancestors were doctors and some served in the military. They weren't military men but they were called up in a time of crisis,. Her husband's great grandfather was career military and served as an aide to General John "Black Jack" Pershing during the Armistice that ended World War I.

Constance Ann Harris was born in Paris, Texas,, on June 25, 1943.

Connie's enjoyed visiting her grandparent's 4,000 acre farm in Fulshear and their big house with the tiny bedrooms. They raised sheep on the farm had many other animals including chickens, cows, cattle, and the horses required to work the cattle.

Several of Connie's ancestors are buried in the Fulshear Cemetery. The oldest relative buried there is probably Tennessee Ann Crawford Hunter who was born in 1843.

Although her ancestors were not considered military men, they served when called up in the War of 1812 (her relative, John Crawford), the U. S. Civil War, and World War II. Her husband's grandfather served as an aide to General John "Black Jack" Pershing towards the end of World War One.

Relatives in Fulshear were overwhelmed by mosquitoes and fled to Galveston where offshore winds pushed the mosquitoes inland so it was more comfortable. They later survived the 1900 Galveston Hurricane in a two-story home when all the buildings around them were destroyed.

Her grandfather bought land when he could including portions from the John Randon League, which were land grants given to the "Old Three Hundred", Stephen F. Austin's Colony, which were the first American settlers in Texas.
