As you will read in his oral history, Don Drachenberg has deep roots in Fort Bend County. They reach back to his childhood in Needville, where his parents were in-volved with the town's school system. The small, tight-knit community seemed limited when he was a boy, but his perspective changed as he grew older. Like others in his family, Don went to Sam Houston State University for his higher education, developing a passion for teaching, particularly American History.

Don and his wife Doris bought a home in Rosenberg where they raised two daughters (both school teachers) and have resided all their married life, over 50 years. Don taught at Dulles High School for 14 years before working in his family camera shop in Rosenberg, Cameras Unlimited. Don and Doris were fully immersed and fully committed to to life in their local community.

There was always the draw of a different life which arose unexpectedly in Don's high school years. The garage band he and his friends started, The Triumphs, became successful beyond their wildest dreams. Their lead singer BJ Thomas opted for fame and fortune (5 Grammies) while Don and the other band members chose quieter lives in their local community, entertaining their loyal fans on the Texas Coast for decades, but never foresaking their small-town life, local roots, and friendships.
