Abstract: Dr. Stanley Thompson

Dr. Thompson was born in 1918 in Calgary Canada, raised in the United States since age 7, and became a US citizen at age 21. He served four years in the US Army Air Corps from 1941–1945. Stanley graduated from the University of Houston with a degree in Chemistry in 1947 and was accepted to Loma Linda Medical School in Los Angeles.

Dr. Thompson's family practice was always located in Richmond. In addition to his active family practice, Stanley also served as chief of staff for Polly Ryon Hospital; was the surgeon for Santa Fe railroad company for 30 years; was the first medical director for Richmond State School; spent 50 years as the team doctor for Lamar CISD; was a doctor for the Texas Prison System; was the doctor for the Fort Bend County jail for 25 years; and, was a charter member of the American Academy of Family Physicians.

In his 60 years of family practice, Dr. Thompson delivered 4,500 babies – a remarkable achievement from a dedicated and remarkable doctor.

Events

Born 1918 in Calgary, Alberta Canada

American parents were farmers in Canada. They moved to the US when Stanley was 7 years old to continue farming in Washington.

Became a US citizen at age 21 in 1939

Drafted into the US Army Air Corps 1941-1945

Married Lila Grace Rapsilver in 1945

Worked for Lila's father in the construction business from 7 a.m. – 3 p.m. Then he hitchhiked from Brookshire to the University of Houston to attend classes from 7 p.m. – 11 p.m. Then he hitchhiked home arriving at 1 a.m. to begin the cycle again.

Obtained a Chemistry degree in 1947 before being accepted to Loma Linda Medical School in Los Angeles, CA.

Stanley and Lila had 3 children: Steve, Judy and Terrell. Terrell contracted measles and developed encephalitis which rendered him profoundly mentally retarded. He resides at Richmond State Supported Living Center (aka Richmond State School) in Richmond, Texas.

Dr. Thompson spent 60 years in his medical practice in Richmond as well as serving in many capacities such as chief of staff for Polly Ryon (aka Oakbend Medical Center), 50 years as team doctor for Lamar CISD, 30 years as the doctor for Santa Fee railroad employees, first medical director for Richmond State School, 25 years as the doctor for Fort Bend County Jail and the Texas Prison system. He made home visits during his first 20 years as a family doctor and delivered 4,500 babies.

He and his family traveled to every state in the US, Canada, Mexico and 90 other countries in Europe, South America, and Asia.

Lila and Stanley lost their son, Dr. Steve Thompson, an orthopedic surgeon, in 2012.

Dr. Thompson's wife died in 2013, the same year he retired.
