Abstract: Duane Bentley Peck & Carole E. Bentley

Ms Peck and Ms Bentley are sisters-in-law and share stories of life in the early years in the quiet, little community of Fulshear, Texas. Duane was born and raised on a farm in Fulshear while Carole moved to Fulshear when she married into the Bentley family whose family ancestors arrived in the area as part of the Old 300 before Texas became a republic.

Duane's father, Carl Briscoe Bentley, was a farmer/rancher. His father also served in the US Army on Okinawa during World Wars II and as Justice of the Peace in Fulshear from 1955–1984 while her mother took care of the family. Duane and Carole discuss the booklet written about their pioneering ancestors which led to naming the newest high school, Foster, after their ancestor who was a scout for Stephen F. Austin.
