Abstract: Frank P. Vacek

Mr. Vacek was born into a Czech family in Fayette County Texas in 1913. He and his wife moved to Fairchilds in 1938 as tenant farmers until he was able to purchase 86 acres of farmland for around \$20,000. He also worked the bar at Fairchilds Hall.

Frank describes farming and harvesting "blue grain" (aka Indian corn) as well as picking and ginning cotton.

Frank was born in Ammannsville, Fayette County, Texas in 1913.

Farming was difficult due to poor soil conditions, so he and his wife moved to Fort Bend County.

He tenant farmed until he was able to purchase 86 acres for about \$20,000.

Frank discusses farming techniques and the use of mules and tractors. He raised various crops such as corn and cotton.

Frank also worked at Fairchilds Hall as a bartender. Now at age 98, he is retired and enjoys time with family and playing dominoes at the Senior Citizens Center in Needville.

Frank's Advice:

Pour cement on or after new moon and it will not sweat.

Good for cough: 1 tsp. lemon juice, 1 tsp. honey, 1 tsp. paregoric. T ake $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. at a time, only not too often. It might become a habit because paregoric is a dope.
