Abstract: Franklin Royce Schodek 08/06/2018

Born in 1937 in Rosenberg, Mr. Schodek is a professional surveyor with extensive knowledge of the historical development of Fort Bend County. He is also the recipient of the Bert E. Bleil Heritage Award.

Franklin's ancestors are from the Czech Republic having migrated to Texas through Ellis Island & Galveston in the late 1800s. He retells stories about the hardships of growing up during the Great Depression and WWII as well as the impact of polio on family and friends.

After one year of college, Franklin returned to Rosenberg and spent his career as a land surveyor. He describes the method of measuring in the early years using a 200 ft tape and a theodolite. Today, land surveyors use GPS and a computer to measure.
