Abstract: Jacquelyn Spencer Leaman

Mrs. Leaman was born at St. Joseph's Hospital in Houston in 1925. Her parents owned a large farm in Simonton, growing potatoes due to the rich red soil. At age 9, she was driving a truck to each potato stand and counting the number of bags picked.

Jacquelyn provides interesting details of growing up in Simonton; attending a small Simonton school and later going to the big city of Rosenberg for middle and high school. She and her husband Dean owned a lumber yard and concrete plant while raising two sons. They lived in the house on Main Ave. in Rosenberg for 51 years until Dean died in 2008.

Born in 1925 at St. Joseph's Hospital in Houston, Jacquelyn spent most of her childhood on a farm in Simonton. Her family mainly raised potatoes due to the rich red soil. In later years, they grew cotton, corn, hay & alfalfa.

She attended Simonton schools until middle & high school which was spent in Rosenberg. After graduation in 1942, she attended Texas State College for Women in Denton, Texas.

Jacquelyn and Dean married in 1947 after she graduated. They raised two sons and owned a lumber yard and a concrete business.

Dean designed and built a small house on Leaman St. in Rosenberg shortly after their marriage. They added on to the house over the years and later moved to a house on Main Ave. and lived there for 51 years until his death in 2008.
