Abstract: John Frierson

Born and raised in Sugar Land, Mr. Frierson's father managed the farming operation at the nearby state prison for 23 years. It was the largest farming operation in the state. The crops mainly fed the prisoners as they worked the land. John describes growing up in prison housing for employees and having prisoners as cooks and helpers in his house.
