Leonard Scarcella, born in Sugar Land but raised in Stafford has served as its Mayor since 1969. He is the longest, continuous serving mayor in the U. S.

Leonard talks about growing up in Stafford where his family have lived since 1935. He played sports in school and enjoying an idyllic life in a small town. His father was an accomplished symphony musician and school band director and his mother was a school teacher of English and phonics for 47 years. The Missouri City school system was made up of White and Hispanic children from Stafford, Missouri City, Alief and surrounding areas.
