Abstract: Leonard Leon Scarcella

Long term Mayor of the City of Stafford, Texas, Leonard Scarcella, gives an in depth interview in which he discusses his family history, the history of Stafford, the Italian migration to Stafford, the prohibition years in Stafford, his tenure as mayor, Texas Instrument's impact on Stafford, the Fort Bend Economic Development Corporation, the decision to abolish Stafford city property taxes, and building the Stafford Center. Elected in 1969, Leonard Scarcella has served as mayor of Stafford City continuously since that time.

1821 William Stafford arrives at Stafford Point, Texas, and establishes a successful plantation that later evolves into Stafford City.

1836 Santa Ana marches his army through the Stafford area on the way from the Alamo to San Jacinto. He burns the town as they are leaving the next day.

1853 First railroad in Texas stopped in Stafford.

1865 Civil War was disruptive on Stafford.

1911-1914 Italian migration to Stafford.

1920's and 1930's Prohibition Years in Stafford

1956 Stafford incorporated.

1963 The Cuban Missile Crisis effect on the 147th Air National Guard Unit at Ellington Field.

1965 Leonard Scarcella writes the first Stafford City Property Tax rolls.

1969 Scarcella elected Mayor of Stafford City (still serving in 2017)

1997 Mayor Scarcella advocates and succeeds in abolishing Stafford City property taxes.

1976 Initiation of the effort to create the Stafford Municipal School District
