Abstract: Melba Marguerite Votaw Gupton

Born in Arizona, Ms. Gupton moved to Texas in 1935 where her parents farmed. She married John Walter Gupton and moved to Richmond in 1949. She recalls meeting her husband and describes his war duties as a PT Boat crash medic. He was also an innovative and beloved veterinarian who ran Richmond Animal Hospital for 32 years.
