Abstract: Robert Crosser

Bob Crosser is Chair of the Cemetery Committee for the Fort Bend County Historical Commission. He and the committee locate cemeteries, plot the area on a map, take photos, document any headstones, and when necessary, file the appropriate paperwork with the County Clerk and the State Historical Commission. Bob also works with the County Attorney's office when a landowner proves difficult in accessing a cemetery or there is illegal activity involving a cemetery.
