Whichard, T. Marshall, Jr. & Mary M. Whichard

Marshall and Mary talk about attending Missouri City High School, the activities before, during and after school, the dances and graduation in the school gym, the teachers, and their friends living in a small town atmosphere where everyone knew everyone and folks took care of each other.

Mary's parents owned a rice farm in Missouri City and used German prisoners of war as laborers during World War II. Her parents fed and treated them well. Mary played in the school band and graduated in 1954. She attended University of Texas.

Marshall at 6'4" played football, basketball and ran track under Coach Lawrence Elkins at Missouri City High School. However, he graduated from a high school in Oklahoma and attended Texas A&M University. While serving in the US Marines during the Korean War, he and Mary married.
