Abstract: Trever J. Nehls

This interview is part of the continuing series entitled "How Government Works". Trever Nehls, Constable for Fort Bend County Precinct 4, explains how a Constable's office works and the interactions with other law enforcement offices. He also explains the benefits to the community and the county of contract patrol deputies and their quick response capability to calls for assistance.
