Abstract: Vance Thomas Cooper

Mr. Cooper conducted this interview on his 64th birthday. He was born in Houston in 1950 but raised in Wallis where he still resides today. He spent his career as a firefighter before becoming an Investigator and Inspector for the Fort Bend Fire Marshal in 1990. Later the department was combined under the Office of Emergency Management (OEM). After 22 years, he retired in 2012 as Fire Marshal.

Vance talks about working and remodeling the building at 307 Fort Street taking out jail cells to make room for offices and storage. Working in a fast growing county, understaffed and with few resources. Staff managed somehow by "working so long with so little that they can do anything with nothing." That got the work done!
