Abstract: Walter C. Todd

Mr. Todd comes from a long and distinguished Texas & Louisiana family with ties to the pioneer Bowie brothers & Privateer Jean Lafitte. His maternal great-great grandfather Louis LaBleu was a ship captain for Lafitte and good friends with the Jim & Rezin Bowie. Today, many of his family still reside in Louisiana in the shrimping business.

Walter's parents grew rice and raised cattle. He describes in details the laborious task of growing and harvesting rice. Rather than become a doctor, Walter followed in his father's footsteps as a successful rice farmer.

Events

Born in 1929 in Lake Charles, Louisiana, Walter shares stories about his maternal ancestors – the LaBleu family. They were originally from France and settled in an area on the Calcasieu River in the early 1700s before there was a United States or a Texas. His ancestors knew Jean Lafitte and the Bowie brothers when they traveled Louisiana. Walter C. Todd

Walter's paternal ancestors were from Scotland and originally settled in Canada before moving to Kansas and finally Louisiana.

Todd's family were rice farmers and raised cattle. Walter shares stories about his ancestors raising and harvesting rice in Fort Bend County. Instead of medical school, Walter chose rice farming.

He and his wife Juanita raised 5 children.
